It's Never Too Late to Remember

-Their passing recorded, their service acknowledged, their lives remembered,

A project three years in the making reached its final stage on Remembrance Day, with the dedication of five newly marked graves of ex-service men at the Foster and Welshpool cemeteries. Previously, these five graves had remained unmarked and unknown, apart from cemetery records. The men had served Australia in either WW1 or WW11, but circumstances had meant their last resting places had remained unmarked.

Due to the quiet perseverance of Foster RSL Sub-Branch's president, Bruce Lester and the lengthy and impeccable research of the club's historian, Mike Heal, the project reached its culmination on Remembrance Day when special ceremonies were held concurrently at both cemeteries during the afternoon, to dedicate the newly placed miniature grave stones, known as grave markers.

The three at the Foster cemetery are those of Able Seaman George Long, WW1; Private William Benson, WW1 and Private Carl Oram, also WW1. At Welshpool the graves are those of Private Rex Bates, WW11 and Private Edwin Mounsey, WW1. There were no unmarked graves of ex-service men at the Toora cemetery.

Funding for the five grave markers was made possible with a \$900 grant from the Australian War Graves Commission and the addition of just under \$4000 contributed by the Foster RSL.

The dedication service at the Welshpool cemetery was conducted by Rod Coughran-Lane, president of the Toora RSL Sub-Branch. A small group of locals were present for the service, with Rod reading out Mike Heal's researched stories of Private Rex Bates and Private Edwin Mounsey. David Grylls and Ben Grylls represented the Welshpool cemetery trust, while Marilyn Smith attended on behalf of the Foster Historical Society. The ceremony concluded with the pensive notes of The Last Post echoing across the bush-lined resting place, announcing "Day is Done".

Private Rex Bates WW11 – Welshpool Cemetery

Rex Bates was born at Heyfield in 1919 but moved to Oakleigh as a child, where he received schooling and did an apprenticeship as a motor mechanic. At the outbreak of WW11 he was working as a truck driver for J Mead at Oakleigh. Rex joined the army in 1940 but was not called up for full duty until 1942. He was classed as a tradesman and remained in Australia for the duration of the war, posted to a number of units as a Driver. These included the Australia Army Service Corp, 3 Ambulance Car Company, 1 Australian General Compound and No. 20 Australian Supply Depot. On his discharge he received a Safe Driving Award, 5000 miles.

Rex married but did not have any children. Rex was related to the harbour master at Port Welshpool, Mr Arthur Bickerton, and in his retirement Rex moved to Port Welshpool to live. It was said that he lived a quiet life helping neighbours and always lending a hand. He enjoyed gardening and fishing. Four years after retiring to Port Welshpool Rex Bates passed away and was interred in the Welshpool cemetery, being survived by his wife Jean. Forgotten for many years, he is now remembered with a marked grave, his name and service details. Lest we Forget.

Private Edwin Mounsey WW1 – Welshpool Cemetery

Edwin Mounsey was born in Carlton in 1890 but his family moved to Welshpool at some time prior to WW1. In 1917 Edwin was accepted into the 1st Australian Imperial Forces. Edwin had tried several times to enlist before but was refused on the grounds of his height which was only five feet one and a half inches.

Edwin would see two years of active service in France with intermittent periods spent in England recovering from the effects of poisonous gas used by the enemy on the front line. He was also hospitalised in France due to wounds received in battle. Returning to England on the hospital ship, St Patrick, he was transferred to the No 1 Machine Gun Battalion in England. He then returned once more to France as part of the Australian Graves Registration Detachment. Edwin returned home to Welshpool and in 1925 he married Lucy Lindsay and they had a son, Keith, born at the private hospital in Foster.

Although Edwin Mounsey's war records reveal only the briefest of details, it is obvious that this young man was one of the bravest soldiers and showed the utmost loyalty to his country. Lest we Forget.

Port Welshpool & District Maritime Museum

Who would have thought.....? As we look back in time that the humble telephone would have become such a big part in our lives.

Alexander Graham Bell started the ball rolling with the patent invention and it became an important part of communication for us to become connected. Turn the handle, an operator would answer and connect you to your requested number local or trunk calls. If you wanted a trunk call, [long distance], the telephonist was at the end of the phone to connect you; with different prices to different areas per three minutes for which at each 3 mins you would be asked, "Are you extending", so you could be manually billed the cost for time spoken. No locked in contracts or a question of who was the best provider with the best deal, it was the one and only Post Master Generals Department, P.M.G for short that controlled it all. The pride of having the first phone in the town gave you the phone number 1, for Port Welshpool it was the shop who got this honour, the now Museum became number 2 and "The Rest" Guest House that was then in Townsend Street number 3. That's all it took to get the phone connected in your town, 3 phones. The telephone exchange how big or small was part of the Post Office of the town. Cast your minds forward, remembering what is required to get a connection now, not to mention the initial getting used to the number and now we have the mobile phone to play with as the land line becomes a thing of the past in some areas for many different reasons. Once only used when necessary, the land line as we now know it, was pride of place in the home as it hung on the wall in all its glory, used only for essential use and only one ring tone, now the variety of ring tones we can choose from is endless. As phones became more affordable and progress was made we were given area codes and more numbers to remember, plus you could dial your number direct, what progress, I remember my Grandmother's Melbourne number was JL4106, and then more progress, it was no letters, just numbers with an area code of numbers AND now the progress is out of control with the mobile phone for everyone in the house hold, young and old, and cost doesn't seem to be a problem. And what can't you do on it? There doesn't seem to be much. Firstly take it everywhere, how many times have you heard said as leaving home "Have you got your Phone"? Who would have thought, contact you anywhere but do they know where you really are? The convenience of a bad line still stands or the total frustration of not being able to connect, at times there is a lot to be said for the landline and a telephonist. With the added invention of the internet the world is our oyster; don't need an alarm clock, radio, Encyclopaedia, Street Directory, Camera, Photo Album, it's all there in your pocket at a press of a button or the command of your voice. But then come all the extra good bits, what a great sense of security as we live alone. Travelling alone fills you with confidence as that calming voice gives you directions and when you miss the advice given no one gets frustrated at your mistake. Then there's the excitement of filming a video, with sound, during that special occasion with the family or friend.

So Mr. Bell you are to be thanked for the original invention that started all this excitement to keep us connected in all forms of our lives and who would have thought that that the humble phone would be by our side 24/7.

I haven't mentioned the public phone boxes that now are very few and far between but once seen everywhere and if only their walls could talk the stories they could tell.....

South Gippsland Shire Council News

Free Green Waste Disposal

South Gippsland Shire Council's annual Green Waste Amnesty has commenced and will run until 31 December 2021.

Residents can dispose of their green waste for free at any of Council's transfer stations during this period.

The amnesty aims to encourage residents to prepare their properties for the fire season by removing potential fire hazards.

However, to improve the quality of the mulch produced, there are several species of weeds that are not accepted as green waste, including Blackberry, Ragwort, Broom, Mirror Bush, Kikuyu Grass, Hawthorn, Cape Weed, Gorse,

Blue Butterfly Bush and Pampas Grass. Species that are difficult to mulch properly are also not included in the amnesty such as palm fronds, Yuccas, Cordylines and other related species.

If any of these species are taken to a transfer station, they must be disposed of as general waste with applicable disposal fees applying. Alternatively, they can be disposed of through the kerbside green waste collection service as this material is subjected to a different composting process.

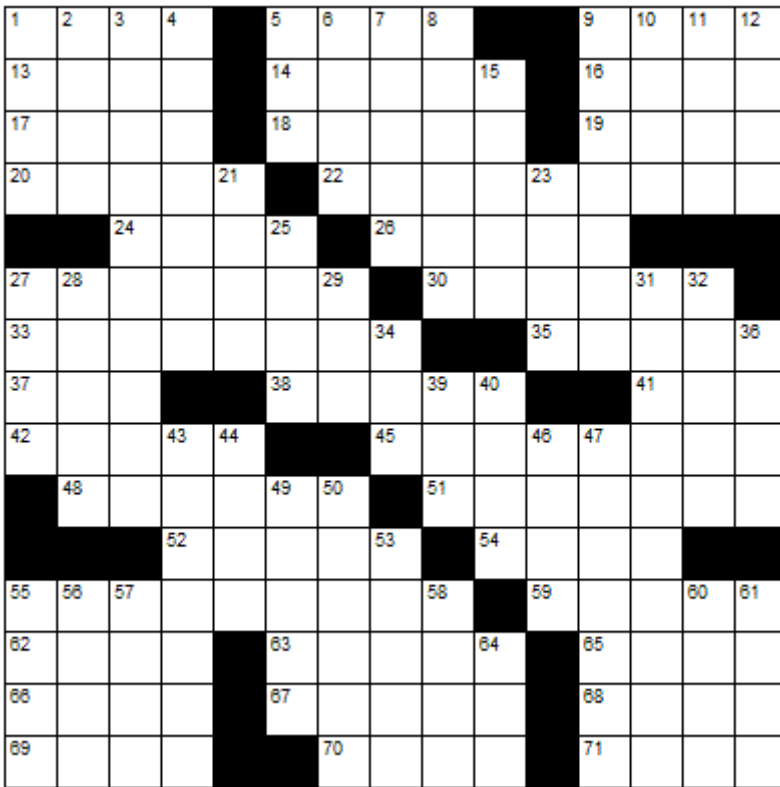
