Port Welshpool and District Maritime Museum

In the last newsletter we looked back in time to reminisce as to what was once at Port Welshpool. This was brought together with some of the photos that came from the community, kindly shared on our very successful "History Gathering Day." An important part of our history was public transport in the form of a horse drawn tram. Back in the day this tram was very historical in its own right, built in 1905. With Wally Mansell at the reins he served the port for 42 yrs, transporting fish, from the little jetty to the Welshpool Station, so the catch could be transported to Melbourne. It was also a mode of transport for the many residents of the port. It is said that one adventurist bride used it for her mode of transport on her wedding day to "Get her to the church on time".

The following articles are from the archives; I hope you find them interesting as we look back

WELSHPOOL TRAMWAY

In regard to the proposal to build a tramway from the Welshpool Railway station to the Welshpool jetty, Mr Bent, Minister for Public Works and Health, yesterday received from Mr Kernot, engineer-in-chief of Railways, a report setting out that a horse-tram could be constructed for £2,462. The distance is a little over three miles, and the residents are urging that the line should be made at the earliest date possible. They promise to guarantee the department against any loss. Mr Bent has been informed that large quantities of fish are sent from Welshpool to the city, and that the proposed line would get the benefit of that traffic. In addition, he finds that, in consequence of the opening of a new sawmill in the district, a good timber trade would be done over the line. Mr. McLean, engineer for Ports and Harbours, has told him that Welshpool is the best port in that part of the state. Mr. Bent seems inclined to consider the request.

INDUSTRY AT WELSHPOOL

Most city people regard fish as somewhat of a luxury. Yet as an article of diet it is a very valuable food. But unless there is encountered at the bay side early in the morning some fisherman disposing of his night's haul at three, four or five a shilling, fish seldom find a place on the average man's menu. The law of supply and demand seems to have been jettisoned in the fishing industry. But the fishermen claim no responsibility for it. According to reports there is at present a bay teeming with fish. The supply is there and so is the demand. But it is "Lent", so vendors explain, and those who desire fish get them no cheaper, if as cheap, as on other occasions. People living near the Bay have been fortunate, however, for some days past by direct dealing with the few fishermen who display their good catches for sale on the beach. Morning bathers become like children in a sweet shop, and on returning home mention their good fortune to their neighbours. Soon business for the fishermen is brisk. Melbourne has a fish market—or should it be a market for the supply of fishmongers? Reports of the activities of this market indicate that a box of fish brought so much. But imagine the average family man straggling home with several dozen fish? He, therefore, does not visit the market, and if he did, as a rival competitor to those who do gather there, he probably would not be very cordially welcomed. In other cities there are fish markets also and a certain proportion of the offering each day is sold in small lots, so that the general public may obtain a frequent supply at fairly reasonable rates. Incidentally, the return to the fisherman is a little better than under the bulk system.

One would hardly expect to find fish included in a Country week display such as is now in progress in Melbourne. Yet it is so, and large numbers of people have been attracted by the splendid collection of fish and marine weeds and growths on show in conjunction with the Welshpool exhibit in Sutton's window in Bourke Street. [This exhibition was some of the cases you can still see at the now Port Welshpool Museum.] In not a few instances it has made city people think. Questions have been frequently asked and as freely answered by Mr. W. B. M. Smith, who has been fishing out of Welshpool for forty years. To him belongs the collection referred to, and he has caught varieties of fish in Bass Strait which experts have been unable to name. Welshpool is the fishing village of Victoria. From it a large percentage of Melbourne's daily fish requirements are drawn. But fishermen complain at the lack of facilities provided for them. There are 34 small fishing boats—that is, craft which win scale fish from the sea just out of Corner Inlet.

In addition there are 32 deep sea and crayfish craft—ketches which go as far afield as the Tasmanian coast. Mr. Smith stated on Saturday that there is only sufficient room at the jetty for one boat to unload crayfish at a time. Consequently some of the vessels have to wait two and three days for their turn. He says that often boats have brought in two tons of fish and have had to dump a ton into the sea again because they could not be got ashore. Some boats go further down the coast to unload.

Then there is the difficulty of getting the fish expeditiously to Melbourne. Port Welshpool is three miles from the Victorian railway system, but it is connected by a horse-drawn tram. This leaves the port about 9 a.m. and the fish have to be sent by it so that they will reach the city early the following morning. The fishermen suggest that if the tram left in the afternoon the position would be appreciably improved. Under present conditions it is necessary in summer to place ice in the boxes with the fish to ensure their reaching the market in good condition. The result is that not so many fish can be put into the box, and more has to be paid in rail freight. The cost of sending a box of fish to Melbourne is 2/9. However, the fishermen practise economy in cool southerly weather, when ice is not used and the boxes are filled. As an indication that the supply of fish is substantial, Mr. Smith said that with a steam trawler he could gather between 30 and 40 tons of fish in five days. With his small boat he returns with substantial hauls and claims to have made a success of the business, because he knows the habits of the fish and when and where to go for them. On one occasion he gathered 1500 boxes of various kinds of fish from eight feet of water in Corner Inlet, and it took eight days to despatch them to Melbourne. He has sent up to nine tons of fish to Melbourne in a week, and ridicules the suggestion of ant scarcity. Asked what he received for his fish he estimated he averaged from 1½d to 2d per lb. all year round. Yet the public in Melbourne would be prepared to pay at least 1/- per lb. But they cannot be brought for that.

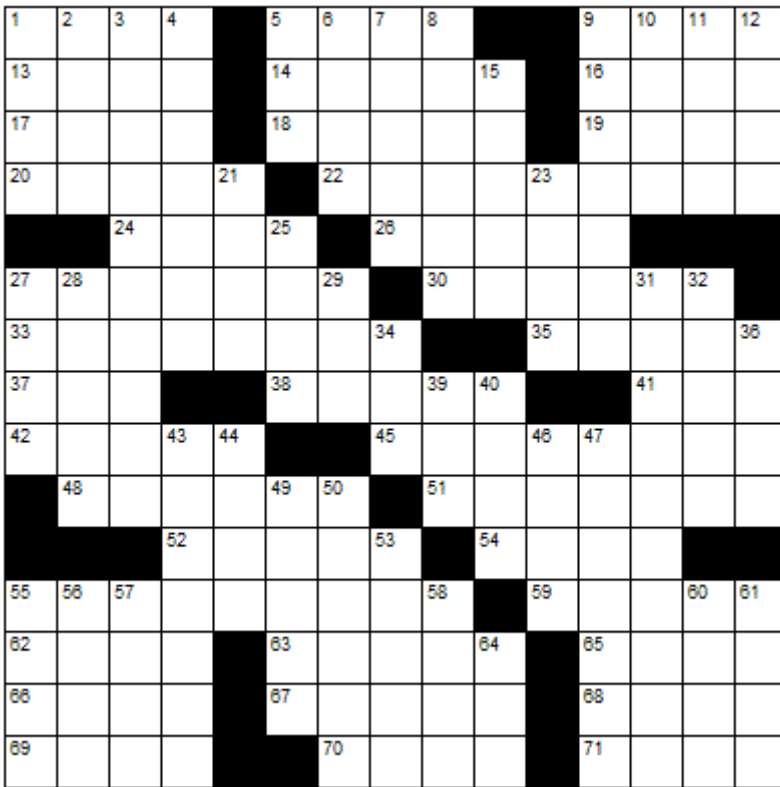
