

Port Welshpool & District Maritime Museum

I hope you enjoy this read, as we step back in time to capture some of the history of parts of the Wilsons Prom. Notably Chinaman's Beach and the township of "Seaforth."

Mining lease on the Prom; going back to the latter half of the 1800's, one of the first notable activities at this Northern Section of the Prom was a mining lease of 25 acres. Taken out in 1866, as the deposits proved to be unprofitable, mining was terminated after 4 short years. This lease was on the South Eastern side of Mount Singapore. After the wreck of the paddle steamer "Clonmel" on a sandbar near to the entrance channel into Port Albert, the barque "Singapore" was dispatched in 1841 to survey the coast of this region. Mount Singapore was named after this vessel which was captained by a Mr. Lewis who also has the honour of the main shipping channel to Port Welshpool being named after him. This honour carried forth to the mainland where the street fronting the township also has his name. On the top of Mount Singapore is believed to be a prominent stone cairn, erected in 1891 by a surveyor Mr. George Black.


Hopefully it is still there today and well preserved. {A cairn is an impermanent human-made pile of stones. The word "cairn" comes from a Gaelic term meaning "heap of stones". One common purpose of a cairn is to guide hikers by marking the trail or a turn in the trail or a mountain top.}

After the Gold rush of the 1850's there was money burning holes in pockets for some, with a result of this new wealth investors sought to buy land. An exciting new township had been surveyed on the Prom and with the views, the railway, Corner Inlet full of fish, what could go wrong?

One local, Mr. Albert James Smith recognised the potential of a tourist influx with the coming of the railway to the region. With land speculation and the connection by the railways to the district, he applied for the leasing of land. He saw the promise of the Northern section of the Promontory as a viable investment with prospects, specifically at the location of Chinaman's Beach. He was granted 3 leases from the Crown each were approx. 3 acres. A.J, as he was known, had a plan to build a hotel on one, a hut on another and the third to have a bathing location, With the arrival in 1892 of the railway and further land speculation, a township envisaged for the site. Surveying was commenced for the layout of the new village which was gazetted in July of 1889 as the town of "Mount Singapore." Lots were drawn up and varied in size from a quarter acre to 6 acre blocks encompassing 400 acres in all. 38 allotments were put up for auction in Melbourne with 20 blocks being sold.

This new township for whatever reason received a name change in 1892 to "Seaforth". How it derived that name is uncertain. Maybe from the Loch on the Outer Hebrides of Scotland or the township near Liverpool in England that bear the same name. Albert Smith who had established a Hotel and a fisherman's hut on the lease relinquished them when they came up for auction under the freehold titles. Mr.T.L. Lewis bought the block which held the fisherman's hut. Similarly, the lot with the Hotel was auctioned and sold to an unknown buyer who in 1893 dismantled the Hotel on the site and had it shipped by barge to Port Welshpool. The building was valued at the time at 300 pounds. At the new location it became a very important part of the




